My time will conclude in June of this year and I have informed the Session that my last Sunday will be May 31, so that I can take my accrued vacation during the month of June. I will then return to my home in Atlanta and seek an appropriate calling there.

The Session has appointed a three person team – Sue Moore, Cathy Arnold, and Jim Rogers – to be in contact with the Presbytery of Tampa Bay for assistance in securing a temporary pastoral leader to serve with you from my departure to the arrival of the next elected pastor.

You will see in the Pastor Nominating Committee update that they are working diligently. Please continue to pray for them in this work and for those they consider. One of those is the one that God will raise up and have prepared to serve you as your next installed pastor.

Thank you for the opportunity to serve in the ministry of Jesus Christ with you. Each one of us has a calling to follow Christ and share from the talents and resources we are given.

At the February 24 Session meeting the following actions were taken:

- Approved a comprehensive investment policy for the funds which shall be received upon the sale of the Gulf to Bay property. The policy establishes a process to request funds to be used for the purposes of enhancing and developing comprehensive outreach programs and to support specific capital needs to replace or maintain facilities to support the operation of outreach programs at Trinity. The goals of these efforts are to go out into the community to serve people as God directs us and to encourage growth in the membership of Trinity Presbyterian Church.
- Appointed elder representatives Marti Folwell and Bill Trautwein to serve with the members who were elected by the congregation to the Church Nominating Committee.
- Received newly elected officers to be installed in worship today.
- Received notice of the resignation of Jimmy Martin as Church Treasurer. The Session expressed its thanks to Jimmy for this service. A new Treasurer will be appointed as quickly as possible.
- Approved using a portion of the Three-Cents-A-Meal offering for the Trinity Friends of Hope.
- Received notice from Interim Pastor Joel Alvis that his time of service will conclude at the end of June. His last day will be on Sunday, May 31, because of his accumulated vacation time.
- In the wake of this announcement, we established a team including Sue Moore, Cathy Arnold and Jim Rogers to be in contact with the Presbytery to determine the availability of pastoral leadership for the time between when Joel departs and the nominee presented to us by the PNC arrives.

The next stated Session meeting will be on Tuesday, March 24 at 7 p.m.





In and Around Trinity



Sunday, March 8, 2015

The KIRKIN' O' THE TARTAN Service was developed in 1941 by Dr. Peter Marshall, then minister of the New York Avenue Presbyterian Church in Washington, D.C. The service draws on the traditions of the church in Scotland to remind us of the past. In addition it is the occasion for all people to offer thanksgiving for their own family and ethnic heritage, and to celebrate God's grace poured out to all generations.

In 1746 the British army defeated forces led by Bonnie Prince Charlie, the last of the Stuart line of English Kings who tried to claim the crown of England, at the battle of Culloden in Scotland. The English Parliament forbade the wearing of tartans and carrying of arms among the Highland clans. This prohibition lasted until 1782.

A legend developed that during this time some Scots wore concealed pieces of their tartan when they went to "the Kirk" (church). At a special point in the service the minister would offer a blessing (Kirkin') while attendees secretly touched their tartan cloth.


The first Kirkin' o' the Tartan service was held in 1941 organized by the Saint Andrew Society of Washington, D.C. Dr. Peter Marshall, born in Scotland, led the service in support of the British War Relief and Scottish Clans Evacuation Plan. The service continued to offer prayers for those living in Great Britain.

Kirkin' o' the Tartans have been held in many Protestant churches over the past 70 years to highlight the connections to history. This year we will share bagpipes, tartans and a bit of our Scottish ancestry on Sunday, March 8 in worship.

The Scottish heritage looms large in our Presbyterian story though by no means solely defining it.

Trinity Work Day February 7, 2015

Another first quarter workday was held February 7, 2015, to start the new year. Over 20 volunteers came out to tackle projects that needed work, and were helpful in preparing for the Presbytery meeting coming up on February 28.

Jim and Patty Rogers fixed the broken door in the second floor, and prepared the yellow paint on the pavement at the north side of the sanctuary for repainting.

The kitchen and library received some attention from Kay McCormick. Some wreaths still need to be stored in the attic. Beverly Easterling picked up litter around the whole property. The sanctuary crew of Jan Wooldridge, Kathy Arnold, Nancy Benchoff, Marge Arnold and Bob Booth vacuumed and cleaned the entire sanctuary, including behind the risers in the Chancel area. Finally, working the whole morning were Ted Maugel, Walt and Karol Freytag and Bobbie Hoopes sorting and filing anthems in the choir area. A good day by all.
