


Stewardship Thoughts for November:

Reflections from Pastor Andy

"Give thanks with a grateful heart..."


This phrase is the beginning of a chorus we have been singing during Sunday



worship at Trinity Clearwater. We sing it as a response to our giving of tithes and offerings. An underlying assumption in this phrase could be that one can be thankful without gratitude or vice versa. Can we "give thanks" without a "grateful heart," or be grateful without being thankful?

I think and believe, as the old song says, that they go together "like a horse and carriage". We don't give or receive the full benefit of either without both. To me it's gratitude that gives grounding and particularity to thanksgiving, while thanksgiving rises above the common place of our lives into the mystery of God's abundance. Another way to think of it is that gratitude is an attitude, while thanksgiving is the expression of that attitude.

So, as we enter the month of November let's do so with gratitude, focusing on the particulars of our lives, identifying something each day for which we are grateful. You many even want to use a journal or diary or the notepad on your phone as a record of your gratitude. Then as the month comes to a close we find our attitudes will have shifted and we are prepared for the day(s) of Thanksgiving for all of God's blessings in our lives. An attitude of gratitude is the beginning of true thanksgiving.

MINISTRY OF THE MONTH: TPC G.R.A.N.T. COMMITTEE

From the earliest days of discussing a possible sale of the Gulf to Bay property, conversations included the questions: "what should the money be used for" and "how will we decide how to use it".

In October 2014, the Gulf-to-Bay Task Force was created by the Session to suggest answers those questions. In February 2015, Session approved GTB Task Force recommendations. Two goals drive all decisions about how the money is to be spent:

To enhance and develop comprehensive outreach programs for children, youth and families of all ages.

To support property needs, specifically, capital expenditures to replace or maintain existing structural integrity for church operation of such programs on Trinity Presbyterian Church property.

The purpose of these programs is to go into the community to serve people as God leads us and to encourage growth in the membership of Trinity Presbyterian Church. Growth means both spiritual and numerical increase. The name of the

G.R.A.N.T. Committee is an acronym for **G**od's **R**esources **A**nd **N**ot **T**rinity's. <u>We want to</u> always be aware that everything we have - our time, our talents and our money - are gifts from God to be used in His service.

Session created the G.R.A.N.T. Committee to review applications and make recommendation to Session about whether or not to fund a proposal. Session then makes the final decision. The six G.R.A.N.T. Committee members are Jim Hayslett, (Chairperson), Edie Banks, Jim McCormick, Robin Powell, Bill Shiels and Patti Rogers. A requestor gets a Program Application or a Project Application form online, completes it and submits it to the Committee.

Since June, six applications were submitted and the five following proposals were recommended for funding. Session approved the first four and will discuss the fifth one at the October meeting.

- Complete the replacement of church windows;
- Support the Preschool & Family Ministry Open House in August. The 2016 Operating Budget will include this expense next year;
