

Why does the church have Deacons?

Deacons and elders are mentioned in Philippians 1:1 and 1Timothy 3:8-12. Deacons were tasked with doing all the other things that mattered in the church, so that the Elders would be able to concentrate on prayer and the ministry of the Word (Acts 6:1-4).

What do Deacons do? They keep in touch with all their parish members, alerting them about activities and making special efforts to aid

those who are in distress, have lost loved ones, are ill or lonely, or reside in long-term care facilities. Deacons are the link to Trinity for many people, sharing God's love by caring.

Do you know how Deacons are chosen? Trinity's Nominating Committee puts together a slate of members who exhibit traits of sympathy, compassion, and love, and if those people agree to serve, the congregation elects them for a 3-year term. They are set apart in a special service of prayer and the laying on of hands.

To whom are Deacons responsible? The Deacons are under the authority of the Session.

How do people in long term care facilities and others who are "homebound" receive Communion? Deacons and Elders take the communion elements to those people after the Communion Service at Trinity, as a way of including them in the congregation and in the circle of God's love, through Christ.

No matter what your score is, you are welcome to visit a Deacons meeting and learn first-hand what a wonderful group of servants we aspire to be.
